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
BOARD MEMBER PROFILE AHMED D. FAHEEM, M.D.

Dr. Faheem is from Hyderabad, India. His medical training and residency was in India, England, and the United States. He won several awards for his teaching of medical students and residents at the University of Missouri – Columbia School of Medicine. Dr. Faheem is board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in General Psychiatry, Geriatric Psychiatry, and Addiction Psychiatry. He is board certified as well by the American Board of Adolescent Psychiatry. Dr. Faheem is a member of the Royal College of Psychiatrists in the United Kingdom and is the author of several scientific papers, a book chapter, and a book on cultural psychiatry. Dr. Faheem is a Clinical Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the West Virginia University in Morgantown in addition to having a full-time private practice in Beckley, West Virginia, where he resides.

Dr. Faheem was elected as a fellow of the American Psychiatric Association in 1989 and has now attained Distinguished Life Fellow status, the highest honor that the profession can bestow. He was the recipient of the Wyeth-Ayerst Outstanding Community Service Award, West Virginia State Medical Association, August 1991. Dr. Faheem has served as the President of Beckley Appalachian Regional Hospital, President of the Raleigh County Medical Society, and as President of the West Virginia Psychiatric Association. Dr. Faheem is currently an Associate Medical Director of General Psychiatry and Medical Director of Adolescent Psychiatry at Beckley Appalachian Regional Hospital. Dr. Faheem also served as the President of the West Virginia State Medical Association from 2001 to 2002.

Dr. Faheem established a Teen Outreach Program in Beckley for troubled teenagers and continues to be an active participant in various community activities. Dr. Faheem chairs the West Virginia Comprehensive Behavior Health Commission and is also a member of the Board of Trustees of Appalachian Regional Healthcare, which oversees nine different hospitals in Kentucky and West Virginia.

National Recognition Earned by Board Investigator

On January 20, 2011, the West Virginia Board of Medicine was notified by the Executive Director of Administrators in Medicine (AIM) that our Investigator, Leslie Thornton, CMBI, will be this year's recipient of the Ronald K. Williamson Memorial Award. This award may be given annually by the AIM Board of Directors in recognition of excellence in the public protection work of board investigators to those who have demonstrated outstanding investigative work and dedication to improving investigative techniques and thus improving complaint-handling services for the public.

Ms. Thornton is certainly deserving of this award, which she will receive at the AIM Awards Luncheon held in conjunction with the AIM Annual Conference Seattle, Washington, this Spring.

Ms. Thornton is also one of the first women in the nation to attain Certification as a Medical Board Investigator through AIM and most recently was instrumental in establishing the West Virginia Chapter of the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators (NADDI).

We are all very proud of Ms. Thornton's recognition at the national level.

WV License No. 21354

<u>Board Conclusion</u>: Relating to unprofessional conduct and relating to licenses in other jurisdictions having been acted against and subjected to disciplinary action.

<u>Board Action</u>: Placed on PROBATION for a period of one (1) year, with specific terms, and PUBLICLY REP-RIMANDED for having his license acted upon in a different state.

<u>Board Action</u>: Dr. Nunan's podiatric license was placed in ACTIVE status effective January 26, 2011, and he paid to the Board \$300 for providing false information to the Board on his applications submitted to the Board, \$200 of which is designated a fine for his deficiency of two (2) hours of continuing education in the subject of end-of-life care, including pain management, during the required period, and \$100 of which is designated administrative costs.

2011 RENEWAL PROCESS

Medical Doctors and Podiatrists

Only those medical doctors whose last names begin with the letters M through Z and all podiatrists are required to renew for the years 2011—2013. For the years 2011—2013, the Board of Medicine will not be mailing a paper renewal application to all the medical doctors and podiatrists who are renewing their licenses. Beginning May 12, 2011, licensees who meet the criteria for online renewal may go to the Board's website at www.wvbom.wv.gov and follow the online renewal directions. The criteria are as follows:

- 1. currently hold an ACTIVE medical/podiatric license; or
- 2. currently hold an INACTIVE medical/podiatric license and will renew in an INACTIVE status; and,
- 3. have obtained the required continuing medical/podiatric education;
- 4. answer "no" to all questions (see "Renewal FAQ's" currently on the Board's website); and
- 5. desire to pay via credit/debit card.

If a licensee is unable to use the online renewal service, he or she will need to request a paper renewal application to complete and return to the Board offices. A request form for a paper renewal application is available on our website under the "FORMS" section and is also available in this Newsletter on page 9. Paper renewal applications will be mailed on May 12, 2011. The online application or paper application must be completed and submitted **BEFORE** Thursday, June 30, 2011, at 4:30 p.m.

Drug Dispensing

On April 12, 2011, those medical doctors and podiatrists who are currently registered with the Board as dispensing physicians will be able to renew their drug dispensing certificates online. These dispensing physicians may go to the Board's website at www.wvbom.wv.gov and follow the online renewal directions. If a drug dispensing physician is unable to use the online renewal service, he or she will need to request a paper renewal application to complete and return to the Board offices. The licensee may call the Board offices at 304.558.2921 x 224 to request a drug dispensing renewal application. The online application or paper application should be completed and submitted **BEFORE** Thursday, June 30, 2011, at 4:30 p.m. There is a \$30 fee for each West Virginia office location where drugs are dispensed. There is also a small credit/debit card convenience fee for renewing online.

CHANGES TO THE UPCOMING RENEWAL PROCESS

- Medical doctors and podiatrists who currently hold an inactive license and will remain in an inactive status may now renew online, provided they meet the above-outlined criteria.
- Page three of the renewal application pertaining to continuing education requirements has been changed
 to include two separate certifications of compliance—one for the 50 hours of continuing education and one
 for the 2 hours of continuing education coursework in end-of-life care, including pain management. The
 Board hopes this change will alleviate the misrepresentations found during random audits of continuing
 education.
- Beginning July 1, 2008, at least thirty (30) hours of the required fifty (50) hours of continuing education must be related to the physician's or podiatrist's area or areas of specialty.
