CONSENT ORDER

The West Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") and Kheyrolah Abedi, M.D. ("Dr. Abedi") freely and voluntarily enter into the following Order pursuant to West Virginia Code §30-3-14(n).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. In May, 1992, Dr. Abedi entered into a Consent Order with the West Virginia Board of Medicine whereby he surrendered to the said Board his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia, License No. 15002. (A true and accurate copy of said Consent Order is attached hereto.)

2. Dr. Abedi has obtained a passing grade on the SPEX examination for which he sat in June, 1993, and pursuant to the provisions of the May, 1992, Consent Order, Dr. Abedi has met with the Complaint Committee of the Board at its regularly scheduled meeting in August, 1993, and has discussed with the Complaint Committee whether further measures might be recommended and/or required with respect to resumption of practice of medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia.

3. Dr. Abedi meets the requirements for licensure under the West Virginia Medical Practice Act, though permitting him a license to practice medicine and surgery without certain restrictions and limitations upon his medical license could adversely affect the health and welfare of a patient.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The West Virginia Medical Practice Act declares that the practice of medicine is a privilege and that as a matter of public policy, the provisions in the act are necessary to protect the public interest (West Virginia Code §30-3-1).

2. Probable cause exists to deny Dr. Abedi's request to resume the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia pursuant to the provisions of West Virginia Code §30-3-14(c) (17) and 11 CSR 1A 12.1(i).

3. The Board has determined that it is appropriate and in the public interest to reinstate the license to practice medicine and surgery of Dr. Abedi, provided that appropriate limitations and restrictions are placed thereon.

CONSENT

Kheyrolah Abedi, M.D., by affixing his signature hereon, agrees solely and exclusively for purposes of this agreement and the entry of the Order provided for and stated herein, and proceedings conducted in accordance with this Order to the following:

1. Dr. Abedi acknowledges that he is fully aware that, without his consent, no permanent legal action may be taken against him except after a hearing held in accordance with West Virginia Code §30-3-14(h) and §29A-5-1, et seq.;

2. Dr. Abedi acknowledges that he has the following rights, among others: the right to a formal hearing before the West Virginia Board of Medicine, the right to reasonable notice of said hearing, the right to be represented by counsel at his own expense, and the right to cross-examine witnesses against him;

3. Dr. Abedi waives all rights to such a hearing;

4. Dr. Abedi consents to the entry of this Order relative to his practice of medicine in the State of West Virginia; and,

5. Dr. Abedi understands that this Order is considered public information, and that matters contained herein may be reported, as required by law, to the National Practitioner Data Bank.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, on the basis of the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and on the basis of the consent of Dr. Abedi, the West Virginia Board of Medicine hereby ORDERS that effective October 1, 1993, the license to practice medicine and surgery of Dr. Abedi, License No. 15002, is reinstated and

immediately suspended for a period of three (3) years, which suspension is stayed, and License No. 15002 is placed in a probationary status for a period of three (3) years, subject to full compliance by Dr. Abedi with all of the following conditions:

1. Dr. Abedi is prohibited from engaging in a solo office practice of medicine and surgery and must locate a place of employment or practice satisfactory to and approved by the Board, where the practice of medicine and surgery of Dr. Abedi may occur only under the supervision of another duly licensed physician approved by the Board who will directly supervise Dr. Abedi's medical practice and who will provide written reports to the Board every sixty (60) days concerning the performance of Dr. Abedi as a physician, except that should the performance of Dr. Abedi at any time fall below the level of reasonable skill and safety, the approved supervising physician shall immediately so notify the Board.

2. Within five (5) days of the signing of this Consent Order by Dr. Abedi, and throughout the three (3) year period of probation, Dr. Abedi shall present a copy of this Consent Order to any employer or health care or medical facility where Dr. Abedi seeks to practice medicine, and Dr. Abedi shall also provide a copy of this Consent Order to his approved supervising physician in order that the approved supervising physician fully understands his or her responsibilities under this Consent Order.

3. At the option of either Dr. Abedi or the Board, this Consent Order or a modified version thereof may be again entered into by the parties at the end of the three (3) year period of probation.

The stay of suspension shall be lifted and dissolved by the Board and the three (3) year period of suspension shall take effect upon order of the Board if at any time during the three (3) year period of probation the approved supervising physician notifies the Board that the performance of Dr. Abedi has fallen below the level of reasonable skill and safety.

The failure of Dr. Abedi to comply with the terms of this Consent Order shall constitute grounds for the revocation of Dr. Abedi's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia.

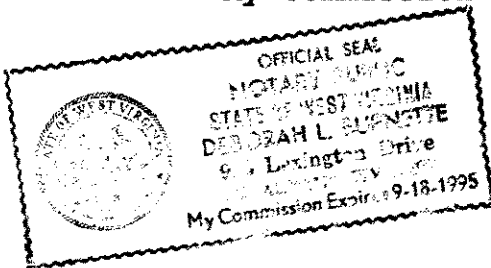

CONSENT ORDER

The West Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") and Kheyrolah Abedi, M.D. ("Dr. Abedi") freely and voluntarily enter into the following Order pursuant to West Virginia Code §30-3-14(n).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Dr. Abedi currently holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia, License No. 15002, issued originally in 1987, and Dr. Abedi's address of record with the Board is in Hurricane, West Virginia.

2. On January 22, 1992, Dr. Abedi entered into a Consent Order with the Board, a true and accurate copy of which Consent Order is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as a part of this Order.

3. Pursuant to paragraph 1 on page 4 of said Consent Order, Dr. Abedi sat for and took the SPEX (Special Purpose Examination), on March 19, 1992, and Dr. Abedi did not obtain a

passing grade on said SPEX as required under the terms of said Consent Order.

4. In the absence of an ability to obtain a passing grade upon the SPEX, continuing to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia by Dr. Abedi could adversely affect the health and welfare of a patient.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The West Virginia Medical Practice Act declares that the practice of medicine is a privilege and that as a matter of public policy, the provisions in the act are necessary to protect the public interest (West Virginia Code §30-3-1).

2. Probable cause exists to file charges against Dr. Abedi pursuant to the provisions of West Virginia Code §30-3-14(c)(17), in that Dr. Abedi has violated an Order of the Board by failing to obtain a passing grade on the SPEX and further, in failing to obtain a passing grade thereon, he may have demonstrated a lack of professional competence to practice medicine with a reasonable degree of skill and safety for patients (11 CSR 1A 12.1[i]).

3. The Board has determined that it is appropriate to waive the commencement of proceedings against Dr. Abedi and to proceed without the filing of charges or a formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing, provided that Dr. Abedi immediately surrenders

his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia.

CONSENT

Kheyrolah Abedi, M.D., by affixing his signature hereon, agrees solely and exclusively for purposes of this agreement and the entry of the Order provided for and stated herein, and proceedings conducted in accordance with this Order to the following:

1. Dr. Abedi acknowledges that he is fully aware that, without his consent, no permanent legal action may be taken against him except after a hearing held in accordance with West Virginia Code §30-3-14(h) and §29A-5-1, et seq.;

2. Dr. Abedi acknowledges that he has the following rights, among others: the right to a formal hearing before the West Virginia Board of Medicine, the right to reasonable notice of said hearing, the right to be represented by counsel at his own expense, and the right to cross-examine witnesses against him;

3. Dr. Abedi waives all rights to such a hearing;

4. Dr. Abedi consents to the entry of this Order relative to his practice of medicine in the State of West Virginia; and,

5. Dr. Abedi understands that this Order is considered public information, and that matters contained herein may be reported, as required by law, to the National Practitioner Data Bank.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, on the basis of the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and on the basis of the consent of Dr. Abedi, the West Virginia Board of Medicine hereby ORDERS that:

1. Effective May 8, 1992, at 5:00 p.m., Dr. Abedi SURRENDERS his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia, License No. 15002, and agrees not to practice medicine and surgery in any way whatsoever in the State of West Virginia.

2. Should Dr. Abedi sit for and take a subsequent SPEX examination, upon the receipt of a passing grade on the SPEX by Dr. Abedi, Dr. Abedi shall meet with the Complaint Committee of the Board at its next regularly scheduled meeting, to discuss with the Complaint Committee whether any further measures might be recommended and/or required with respect to any resumption of practice of medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia, and the Board may require Dr. Abedi to enter into another Consent Order containing restrictions and limitations upon his medical license, as and when it is restored, as it may determine necessary and appropriate.


3. Within five (5) days of entry of this Order, Dr. Abedi shall provide a copy of this Order to any employer or health care or medical facility where Dr. Abedi has been practicing medicine since January, 1992, and during the period that this Order is in effect, and as long as Dr. Abedi's license to practice medicine and surgery is surrendered, he shall provide a copy of this Order to any prospective employer or health care or medical facility where he seeks to practice medicine.


The failure of Dr. Abedi to comply with the terms of this Consent Order, as determined by the Board, may constitute grounds for the revocation of his medical license in West Virginia.

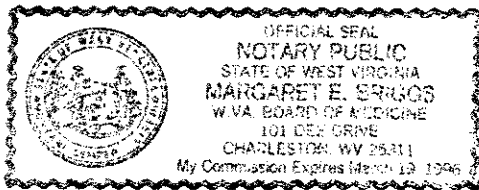

CONSENT ORDER

The West Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") and Kheyrolah Abedi, M.D. ("Dr. Abedi") freely and voluntarily enter into the following Order pursuant to West Virginia Code §30-3-14(n).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Dr. Abedi currently holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of West Virginia, License No. 15002, issued originally in 1987, and Dr. Abedi's address of record with the Board is in Hurricane, West Virginia.

2. In January, 1992, the Board discussed with Dr. Abedi the matter of his resignation from the emergency department of Bluefield Regional Medical Center in 1990, as well as material provided by Bluefield Regional Medical Center upon request of the Board, related to Dr. Abedi's resignation.

3. Continuing to practice medicine without the Board attaching conditions and limitations upon Dr. Abedi's license to practice medicine could adversely affect the health and welfare of a patient.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The West Virginia Medical Practice Act declares that the practice of medicine is a privilege and that as a matter of public policy, the provisions in the act are necessary to protect the public interest (West Virginia Code §30-3-1).

2. Probable cause exists to file charges against Dr. Abedi pursuant to the provisions of West Virginia Code §30-3-14(c)(17), violating a rule of the Board, in that the Board is of the belief that Dr. Abedi may have demonstrated a lack of professional competence to practice medicine with a reasonable degree of skill and safety for patients (11 CSR 1A 12.1[i]).

3. The Board has determined that it is appropriate to waive the commencement of proceedings against Dr. Abedi and to proceed without the filing of charges or a formal Complaint and Notice of Hearing, provided that Dr. Abedi agrees to sit for the SPEX examination in West Virginia, and obtain a passing grade thereon, and practice under the supervision of another Board approved physician until such time as Dr. Abedi's SPEX score is received, all in order that the Board may then determine what, if

any, additional requirements as to his practice of medicine may appropriately be imposed upon Dr. Abedi by the Board.

CONSENT

Kheyrolah Abedi, M.D., by affixing his signature hereon, agrees solely and exclusively for purposes of this agreement and the entry of the Order provided for and stated herein, and proceedings conducted in accordance with this Order to the following:

1. Dr. Abedi acknowledges that he is fully aware that, without his consent, no permanent legal action may be taken against him except after a hearing held in accordance with West Virginia Code §30-3-14(h) and §29A-5-1, et seq.;

2. Dr. Abedi acknowledges that he has the following rights, among others: the right to a formal hearing before the West Virginia Board of Medicine, the right to reasonable notice of said hearing, the right to be represented by counsel at his own expense, and the right to cross-examine witnesses against him;

3. Dr. Abedi waives all rights to such a hearing;

4. Dr. Abedi consents to the entry of this Order relative to his practice of medicine in the State of West Virginia; and,

ORDER

WHEREFORE, on the basis of the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and on the basis of the consent of Dr. Abedi, the West Virginia Board of Medicine hereby ORDERS that:

1. On March 19, 1992, Dr. Abedi shall sit for and take the SPEX (Special Purpose Examination), which SPEX shall be administered in Charleston, West Virginia, at the Board offices, and Dr. Abedi shall obtain a passing grade on said SPEX.

2. Upon and after the effective date of this Order, Dr. Abedi's practice of medicine and surgery shall occur only under the supervision of another Board approved physician, at any site where Dr. Abedi is practicing medicine and surgery, which Board approved physician shall file written reports with the Board every sixty (60) days, beginning March 1, 1992, attesting to Dr. Abedi's safe care and treatment of patients, and said Board approved supervising physician shall notify the Board in writing if at any time Dr. Abedi's care and treatment of patients falls below a reasonable standard of skill and safety.

3. Within five (5) days of entry of this Order, any Board approved supervising physician for Dr. Abedi shall file with the Board a statement confirming that the Board approved supervising physician has read a copy of this Order and has a copy of this Order in his or her possession and understands the requirements of this Order.

4. Upon the receipt of the grade on the SPEX of Dr. Abedi, Dr. Abedi shall meet with the Complaint Committee of the Board at its next regularly scheduled meeting, to discuss with the Complaint Committee whether any further measures might be recommended and/or required with respect to his practice of medicine in the State of West Virginia, and the Board may require Dr. Abedi to enter into another Consent Order containing restrictions and limitations upon his license, as it may determine necessary and appropriate.

5. Within five (5) days of entry of this Order, Dr. Abedi shall provide a copy of this Order to any employer or health care or medical facility where Dr. Abedi is practicing medicine, and during the period that this Order is in effect, Dr. Abedi shall provide a copy of this Order to any prospective employer or health care or medical facility where he seeks to practice medicine.

The failure of Dr. Abedi to comply with the terms of this Consent Order, as determined by the Board, may constitute grounds for the revocation of his medical license in West Virginia.
